Very few of us are called to be a Martin Luther or a Martin Luther King, Jr., or a John Wesley; but, all of us are called to be faithful to that which God has called us. We all work together as the body of Christ and each of us has a place in Christ's Church. Neither underestimate nor overestimate your importance. In humble, faithful service we are being knit together as Christ's Church through the Holy Spirit working within us and among us.

I stress "within us and among us" to reflect the personal nature of spiritual grown and the communal nature of spiritual grown in and with a community of believers, such as First United Methodist of Galax in union with Christ's universal (catholic) Church throughout the world.
