

PASTORAL PONDERINGS

Autumn is upon us! Welcome to one of the prettiest months of the year, October. Normally, we would be in the midst of High School football, but at least there have been a few college games and NFL games are in full season; but, I wonder how long it will last. Nevertheless, watch it while you can if you enjoy it. Like the fall leaves it may be here today and gone tomorrow.
