Our Kid Junction program was going well until March and the Pandemic struck!!! We had taken advantage of the sales on winter coats and purchased a good amount for our winter season. So, the good news is we have coats for the winter season. The bad news is we were not here to promote our Back to School campaign. We wanted to do our part in helping out local children, so we came up with an alternative plan. Most of our school supplies and backpacks were close to being depleted and our account balance was much lower than usual.

I first got in touch with the Galax Elementary School assistant principal to check about the material list for the students. She then returned to me the supplies needed for three grade levels and number of total students/grade level. After searching the Internet for the best prices, Kid Junction had enough funds to purchase primary pencils and journals for 100 kindergarten students. I then took this information to Pastor Mark and it was at this point he recommended that he send out an approved email, which he did. Since that email we received \$545 in donations. A check for that amount was delivered to Galax Elementary School to order specified supplies for whichever grade is in need of them. (By the way, we are among several other churches in the area helping to supply grade level materials.)

Our committee would like to say thank you, thank you, thank you for your prayerful and generous contributions in supporting our local elementary school children. We, as a committee, are truly grateful for the support you give us in seeking to serve the children of this area and their families with your prayers and contributions, monetary or other ways.

Another way in which we have served some of our clientele was sending out text messages. About thirty text messages were sent to those who have been seeking assistance consistently. Of those people, we were able to serve the 6 families (and 11 children) who responded with sizes needed and hygiene items. The items were bagged and labeled. The parents were notified and were able to pick them up in the church office. A huge thank you to Diane Palumbo for helping us out so much in so many ways and to Jolene for assisting with the financial end!

We are receptive to new ideas and suggestions in how we can better serve the children in the area. You may pass these along to anyone in the office, Elsie Davis, or Dianne Marshall.
